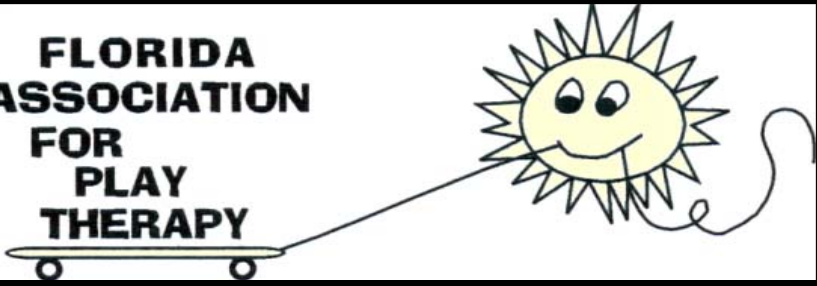

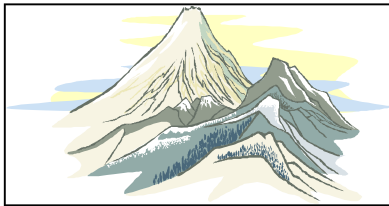

In this issue we meet **Penny L. Phares, MSN ARNP (Nursing), Registered Play Therapist** City: Yankeetown

Practice Location: I practice in Inglis, Florida at Isaiah's Place, a small nonprofit Family Play Therapy Center.

What moved you to learn about Play Therapy?

I was working for the State of Florida as a pediatric specialist and discovered that almost a third of our patients were being diagnosed and treated for behavior problems. As a psychiatric Nurse Practitioner, I had done play therapy in schools after reading Virginia Axline's book in the early 80's.

In 1998, I attended an AACC conference where **Daniel Sweeney** spoke and I bought his book. I decided that if I could treat children successfully in play therapy I would need more training and my own playroom. **Dr Sweeney** encouraged me to meet **Garry Landreth** and I attended a 10-day summer Institute in Denton, TX at the Center for Play Therapy. It was grueling and exhilarating.

Did you have any classes in Play Therapy in your graduate program? If not, how did you go about getting your Play Therapy education?

In graduate school, we treated families but not children. All of my play therapy education has been through reading **Axline, Sweeney, Brody**, and attending conferences by **Garry Landreth, Louise Guerney (NIRE)** and **APT**. I will often attend conferences in Michigan where my children live and have had supervision and sand tray experience with **Dr. Linda Homeyer** and **Kay Hannah**.

Do you have a favorite Play Therapy book? What is it and who is the author?

I always recommend **Garry's** book "The Art of Relationship" as the Gold Standard for Play Therapy, but **Daniel Sweeney's** book, "Helping the Hurting Child," was a kind of helpful cookbook. All of my play therapy education has been through reading **Axline, Sweeney, Brody**, and attending conferences by **Garry Landreth, Louise Guerney (NIRE)** and **APT**. I will often attend conferences in Michigan where my children live and have had supervision and sand tray experience with **Dr. Linda Homeyer** and **Kay Hannah**. My favorite sand tray book is by **Boik and Goodwin**. It has a good history of sand tray and delves into psychotherapy.

If you had to identify only one essential lesson you've learned from a clinical supervisor, what would it be?

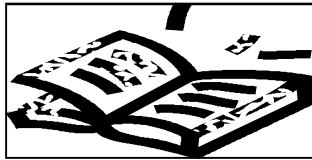
The play therapy process is an emotional process for the therapist (as well as the child). Personally, I have to work on my own emotions and not intruding with the child's play.

What is one thing you feel you still need to learn?

I have to continue to monitor my own boundaries. I live in the same small area I practice in. There are very few play therapists in this 5-county rural area and the number of referrals for young children increases every year. I have been in solo practice for 5 years and if I am going to continue for another 15, there will have to be more therapists.

What advice would you give to a student who said they wanted to become a Play Therapist?

Go for it! There is nothing that helps children more if the process is adhered to. It is very hard work and collaboration and supervision are essential. Join the APT now. The information you get from other people about conferences and books is such an encouragement. APT is so helpful to it's members.



BOOK REVIEW

The Manipulative Child: How to Regain Control and Raise Resilient, Resourceful, and Independent Kids. (1996).

Manipulation has extensive meanings. It is often a synonym for exploitation, management, handling, operation, and treatment. To manipulate is to skillfully maneuver a task. In psychology, manipulation is usually expressed as a cognitive skill, that for the most part, is perceived as a negative quality.

In this book the authors write "two special kinds of behavior learned through negative reinforcement that are essential to understanding manipulation: escape and avoidance" (p. 23).

They further elaborate on the concept of avoidance, and how children use their manipulation to escape from uncomfortable feelings and thoughts.

It seems that anxiety covers up with manipulative behavior that is unconsciously performed.

The authors further postulate that "manipulators are only vaguely aware of the untruths and reality distortions underlying what they are trying to do, or they have convinced themselves that their lies are all right..." (p. 35).

The last chapters discuss effective ways of dealing with manipulative children.

As therapists, I would recommend, to try and find out what it is that the child is avoiding, or escaping, which should open the door to the hidden garden of the child.

I am a licensed bilingual school psychologist and mental health counselor and hold certifications in elementary, exceptional education and pre-k.

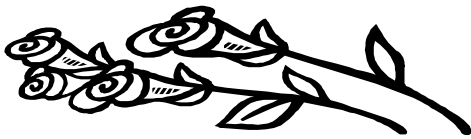
